

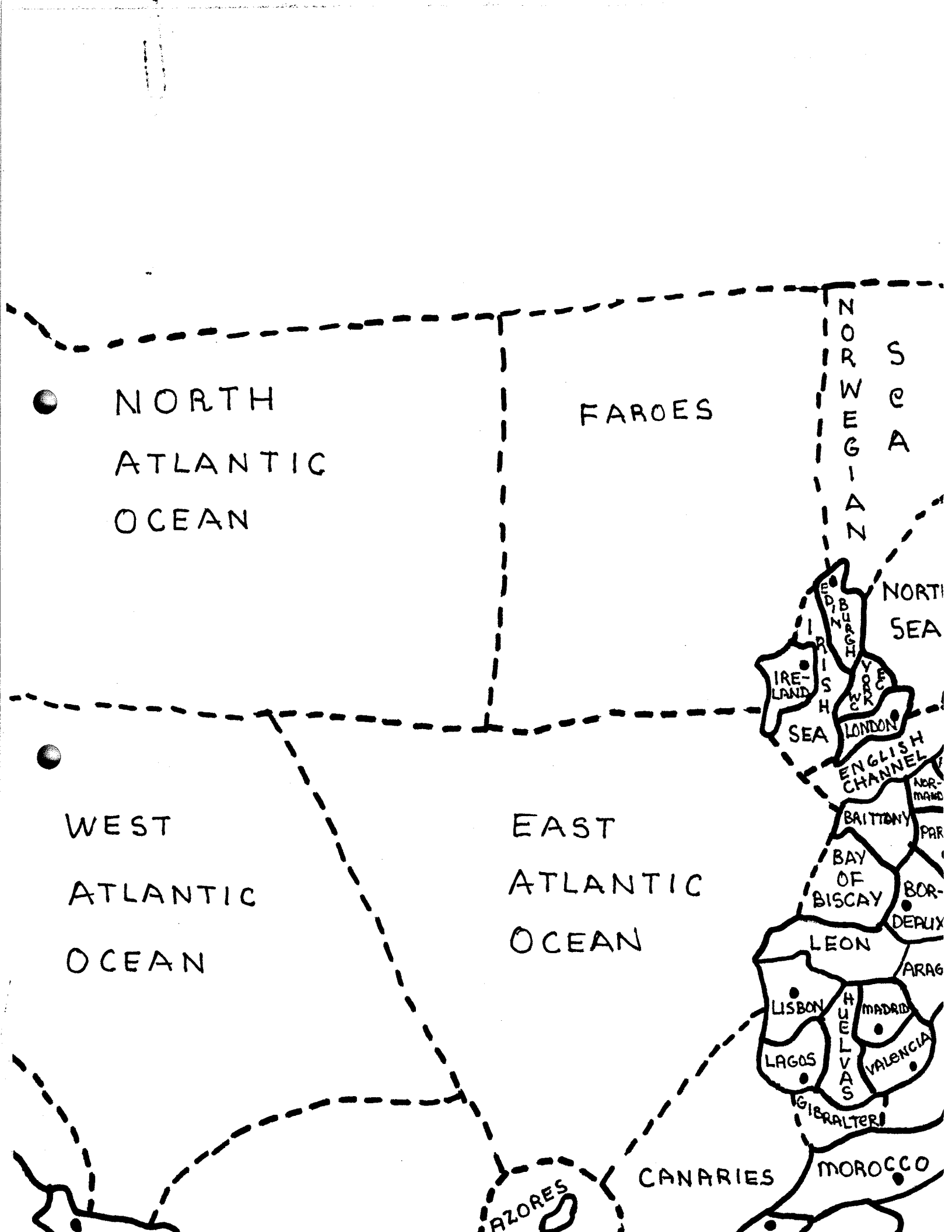
COLONIA V

1. The rules are the same as those in the 1971 Diplomacy Rulebook, except as noted below.
2. The Powers and starting positions are:

AUSTRIA:	Armies: Vienna, Budapest, Florida Fleets: Trieste, Hawaii
CHINA:	Armies: Peking, Sian, Wuhan Fleet: Amoy
ENGLAND:	Armies: Ecuador, Nigeria Fleets: London, Edinburgh, Malaya
FRANCE:	Armies: Paris, Toulon, Quebec, Dakar Fleet: Bordeaux
NETHERLANDS:	Armies: Antwerp, Surinam, Angola, Goa Fleets: Hague
OTTOMAN:	Armies: Izmir, Jerusalem, Baghdad Fleets: Istanbul, Tahiti
PORTUGAL:	Armies: Lagos, Alaska, Cape Colony Fleets: Lisbon, Australia
RUSSIA:	Armies: Moscow, Omsk, Ifni, Brazil, Kiev Fleets: Vladivostok, St. Petersburg(sc)
SPAIN:	Armies: Madrid, Mexico, Somalia Fleets: Valencia, Manila
3. Note that the provinces on the easternmost edge of the map are the same as those on the westernmost edge. Thus, a Fleet could move from Bismarck Sea to South Pacific to Peru, and vice versa.
4. Those islands which are marked as "neutral supply centers" may be occupied by an Army. An Army dislodged from an island may retreat to another island or mainland province, via Fleet Convoy PROVIDED there is a Fleet available to make the convoy and PROVIDED the retreat does not exceed one sea-space. The retreating Army and convoying Fleet must be of the same nationality. An Army dislodged from Fiji could retreat to New Zealand by convoying across the Coral Sea, but could not retreat to Guam, which is two sea-spaces away. This rule applies only to Armies dislodged from island centers. An Army dislodged from "mainland" or "continental" coastal provinces may not be convoyed in retreat. Under this rule, the islands of BRITAIN and AUSTRALIA shall be considered as "mainlands".
5. There are certain supply centers marked as 'colonies'. Colonies are building centers for whichever Power controls them. They start under the control of the Power with starting units placed there. The colonies are: Alaska, Quebec, Florida, Mexico, Ecuador, Surinam, Brazil, Ifni, Dakar, Nigeria, Angola, Cape Colony, Somalia, Malaya, Goa, Manila, Hawaii, Australia and Tahiti
6. There are three 'special supply centers' which may be used for building purposes by specified Powers. The centers, and Powers, are: CRIMEA - Russia and Ottoman; NAPLES - Spain and Austria; CANTON - China. The centers may be used for building only after being occupied. For all other Powers, these centers function as 'neutral supply centers'.
7. Although the ARCTIC OCEAN and the continent of ANTARCTICA are impassable, the Arctic Coast of Siberia shall be passable to Fleets.

8. Victory will consist of ownership of Fifty (50) supply centers by a single Power, or by concession vote. In order for a concession proposal to be approved, the proposal must carry by a Three-Fourths (3/4) Majority of all supply centers, excluding supply centers which may neutral at the time of the vote. Thus, with all supply centers occupied, Powers controlling a total of Ninety-Six (96) supply centers can end the game by voting to do so. Such proposals may be made at any time, but the voting will take place in the Winter Season with Winter Adjustments.
