 CONTINENT - (1971)

The rules for Continent are the same as those given in the SHAAFT HRs with the exceptions listed below. Numbers refer to SHAAFT Rules Supplement #1, section I.

- 1) Continent is played by six players, each of whom shall represent one of the following South American countries: Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Columbia, Peru, or Venezuela.
- 3) Replace "supply center" by "province" the second, third, and fourth times it appears in this paragraph.
- 4) Ditto the third time it appears in this paragraph.
- 6) Replace "Europe" with "South America" and "...18 units on the board..." with "...control of 18 supply centers...".
- 8) Prior to the start of the game each of the countries named above controls the supply centers within its boundaries. The first move of the game is Winter 1972.
- 9) For Winter 1972 only no builds may be made in South Amazonas(36), Guapere(43), Acre(44), or Magallanes(91). Every country must build at least one fleet and Argentina and Brazil must build two in that season.
- 14) Delete the first two sentences. Replace "...St. Petersburg, Spain, or Bulgaria..." with "Cartagena(7)".
- 15) The countries of Costa Rica(1) and Panama(2) are neutrals which may not be entered. The Canal Zone(3) may only be entered by fleets and such fleets will be "interned" (i.e. annihilated) if they remain more than one year. A fleet in the Canal Zone can attempt either the Caribbean(5) or the Gulf of Panama(14), regardless of its direction of entry.

The provinces and bodies of water on the Continent map are listed below. Provinces belonging to the six combatant countries are indicated by letter code. Supply centers are indicated by asterisks.
