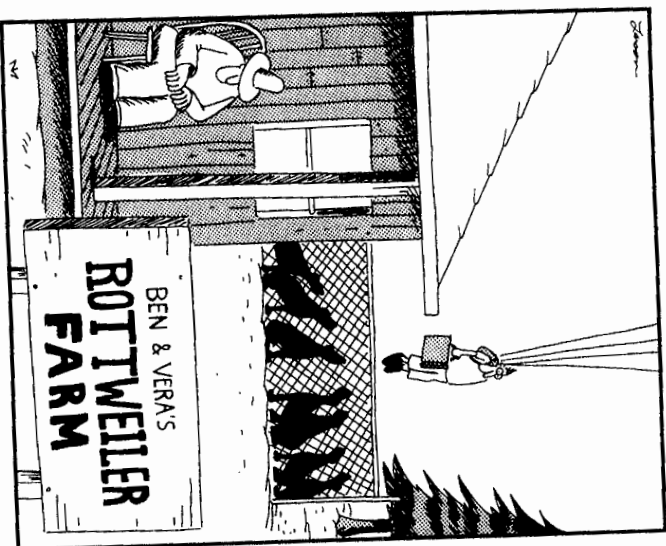

A final couple of notes on Manorcon. The pop quiz on Saturday night was expertly run by David Gates, Dave Gittins team won as usual. Our best round was, of course the 60's round where our score was nearly twice that of the second placed team. Dave says he might run the quiz next year so I'll look forward to that.

The second hand games stall raised over £2500 despite the sellers having to carry their games up two flights of stairs. Alan Parr, Dennis Arnold and Mike Taylor once again worked hard at making the sale a success.

Mike and Dennis also introduced me to a fun card game called Colouretto. The rules are extremely simple, on your turn you either take a card and add it to a row, or you collect all the cards in a row (max 3). There are 7 different coloured cards and the twist on the scoring is that you only count your best three colours as positive. If you have more than three colours, and it's difficult not to collect at least four, the other colours count negative. Scoring is as follows (plus or minus) 1 card scores 1, 2 cards score 3, 3 cards score 6, 4 score 10, 5 score 15 and 6+ score 21. There are also some cards which merely add +2 to your score for that round. It's normal to play 4 rounds and total the scores for all rounds to find the winner. It's a deceptively simple game with lots of tactical opportunities. Highly recommended.

Editorial

Mr Haytack, to lose one sub-zine editor can be regarded as a misfortune but to lose two seems like carelessness!

Paul Holgate started his subzine in Bloodstock in issue 28. He ran two games initially, Shoc and Golden Mile. Before long his sub-zine was up to 16 pages (nearly half the zine) and he was running seven or eight games, some of these had well over 20 players and one - Brawl had over 60. Several games were ones he'd invented such as Treasure Hunt. HHH won the sub-zine poll at least twice (it may have been 3 times) and I'm sure it's because of Paul that we attracted many of our subbers. Anyway, Paul has now decided to give HHH a rest for a while until he gets back ahead of himself - timewise. I'm sure you'll all join me in thanking Paul for his efforts over the past 13 years and if he finds the time, he'll be more than welcome to resume his sub-zine. In the meantime, he'll carry on as manager of Stannore United in 'On the ball', his team currently joint top of division 3. We could be playing each other next season.

Ok, on to Manoreon. Ben and I arrived on Friday afternoon to find well over 50 gamers already there and several games in full swing. Having signed up for the croquet I looked around for a game. Puerto Rico was as popular as ever and I was quickly roped into a game. I drew position five, not one of my favourites and finished 4th (on a tiebreak). The clear winner was Richard Beattie. I don't seem to be able to vary my tactics sufficiently depending on player order. Although I win a few games and usually finish second or third in the others, I can't quite put my finger on what I do right in some games and wrong in others. Maybe it's down to what the

other players do, rather than my efforts. Still, it remains a game a really enjoy playing.

Several of us went out for a meal in Chinatown, it was adequate, but rather expensive, the Fortune river in Roundhay. Leeds has much better food and is better value for money. Still, I enjoyed the company. John and Jack Harrington, Pete Birks, Richard Beattie, Alan Shaples, Marcus Welbourne, Geoff Brown and Ben. Jack wasn't tempted to eat any raw chillies this year but then again Oakes wasn't there to talk him into it.

After the meal we had a Poker freeze out, there were eight of us and was rather surprised when John put up the money for Jack to play. Alan Shaples was the early chip leader but tried to steal the pot a few too many times and was quickly pegged back. I was impressed with the way Pete Birks read one of my hands. I had called before the flop and although I can't remember the flop there were opportunities for a straight but not a flush. After 4th street Pete put in quite a large bet, I was fairly certain he didn't already have a straight so I put him with something like 8-9-T-J I raised him all-in and he thought for a while. "You haven't got a straight", he said, "I reckon you've slow-played a big pair". He was dead right. I had two kings. He folded, which was certainly with the odds but when he went out a few hands later he said he thought he should have taken a gamble and called.

One by one the fancied players were eliminated until there were just three. Me, Peter Card and 12 year old Jack. The blinds were now 400 and 800 (we started with 1500) so when I was dealt A-T, I put in a raise. Jack called all-in with a pair of twos and Peter called with Q-9. Jacks twos stood up and he was the

chip leader. I lost my remaining chips a few hands later so Jack and Peter were heads up. Jack probably had 60% of the chips but I reckoned Peter was the favourite. How wrong I was. I can't remember the hand that clinched it but young Jack more than justified his dad's faith in him by winning the first prize of £100. I was happy to finish third and get my money back.

Nick Parish had beaten me in the croquet final for the last two years so I was more than relieved to see that he hadn't entered this year. However there were a few dangerous players in the competition, especially Gary Duke a 10 handicap player (mine is 18). I got through the first round fairly easily 14-4 against Simon Hornby. My next opponent was Chris Dawe who I'd seen play some very good croquet when he eliminated Keith Loveys. I managed to leave him very few opportunities and although he managed one good break I won 14-5. In the semi-finals I was up against Martin Burroughs. I'd played him before and beaten him but this year he was playing much better. However, I had the run of the balls and once again I was able to control the game eventually, winning 14-3.

So, for the third year in a row I was in the final. My opponent was, as I'd expected, Gary Duke. Neither of us started well. I think we both had a couple of early chances which we failed to take advantage of but when I got a third chance I managed to run the first five hoops, peel my other ball through hoop one and finish with a good leave. He failed to hit in and I was back in with my other ball. I didn't manage to finish my one visit, in fact it took me three or four visits but Gary had no luck at all, he missed two or three roquets by the narrowest of margins and I won by the very flattering margin of 14-2. After

several years of trying I had finally won the event and I was absolutely delighted. I hope to defend the title next year. I do hope Nick stays away again.

The Treasure Hunt this year was organised by Chris Boote. He must have put hours and hours of work into it, some of the problems were reasonably easy but some were almost impossible. I was in a team with Sid Ramage, David Title, John Colledge, Kath Colliman and Alan Harvey. The star of our team was undoubtedly David. He was very quick to spot the way to solve several of the clues, without him I don't think we'd have finished. As it was we solved all the problems and we finished second, about eight minutes behind the winning team. I don't know how the others felt but I was absolutely worn out, my brain was numb. Nevertheless I was very impressed with the thought and ingenuity that had gone into some of the problems. For instance the first five problems each gave you a two digit number. You were told that nothing came before the answer and when you put it all together you got the mobile phone number of Chris's wife Julia. When you dialled the number there was a recorded message "Hello, this is Julia, if you're doing the Treasure Hunt then the answer is 'Green eggs and ham'. If not can you leave a message, or call me back later". We told Chris the answer and he said "Where would you find that?" We looked in the kitchen and there was the next envelope. It was a very enjoyable way to spend three hours but I wouldn't want to do it more than once a year.

The Diplomacy was won by Ivan Woodward, I don't know any of the other results but they'll be on the website in the fullness of time.
