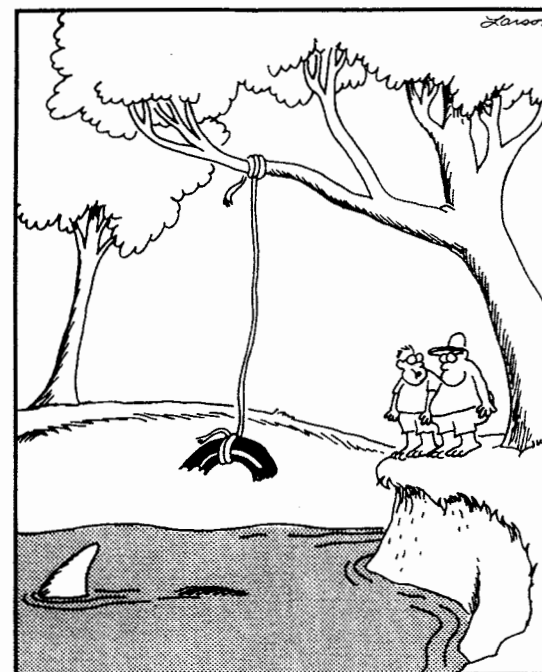

Although I won Silver and Bronze medals in the poker at Mindsports they could easily have been a couple of Golds. In the heads-up Omaha I held A ♣ 10 ♣ A ♦ 10 ♠ and went all-in. The flop was a very disappointing 3♦ 5♦ 7♦ giving my opponent a flush and me virtually no outs. In the 2-day 7 card stud I held the smallest number of chips with three players remaining. The chip leader had to make a compulsory bet with a 5, Ben went all-in with a Ten showing and I had K ♥ showing with 2 red Aces in the hole. That looked like an all-in bet to me but although I ended up with 7 red cards I didn't hit a flush while Ben made 2 pairs and the chip leader made a flush on the river. All three medals were decided on one hand. In the bridge Senior pairs I picked up the best hand I've ever had ♠ A K Q J T 9 4 ♥ A K Q 3 ♦ K 7. I opened 4NT (specific Ace asking) and when my partner responded 5♦ I bid 7♠. There was an uncomfortable moment when the opening leader asked my partner what the 4NT was. "Blackwood," he replied. I was quite relieved when the opening leader placed A ♣ on the table. Partner had the Q ♦ to go with his Ace so I could claim at trick one.

## Editorial

## Keith Loveys

I'm afraid that we start with some very sad news. Keith Loveys, one of our founder players in Bloodstock has died suddenly and unexpectedly. From what I've been told he had some sort of problem with his appendix. I didn't know Keith very well as a person, he was a quiet sort of chap but his reputation as a games player was second to none.

He folded his first zine Snorwood Gazette in 1982 (the year I joined the hobby). Apart from the fact it was one of the first multi-games zines (i.e. not just Diplomacy) I can't tell you much about it. It ran for 42 issues.

Shortly after that fold he started Track Events which, as its name implies ran mainly railway games. He later added a United league which ran for several seasons before reverting to 18XX games with the addition of Outpost. He had just published issue number 252.

As an editor and GM he was totally reliable, he very rarely made mistakes with his adjudications and I can't ever remember his zine being seriously late.

But, it's as one of the hobby's great games players that I'll remember him. Not just for the quality of his gaming but at times for the sheer quantity. I once tried to count the number of games he was playing at the same time and it came to well over 120. Included in this were over 20 postal football games and 10 or more Diplomacy games and variants. He was involved in 10 games currently running in Bloodstock.

He was also a top-class bridge player, I think he had represented England on at least one occasion and I know the late Richard Sharp rated him as the best bridge player in the hobby.

So, it's goodbye to yet another hobby legend and one who I will really miss.

Ben and I spent most of the last two weeks at the 7<sup>th</sup> Mindsport Olympiad in Manchester. I had some modest success, a Gold in the Lost Cities and a Silver and Bronze in the poker. However, my success pales into insignificance compared to Ben who picked up two adult Silvers in Puerto Rico and poker and a Bronze in Pacru. He won 7 further junior medals 4 Gold and 3 Silver. The best of these was in the Lost Cities where he needed to win his last match 2-0 to win the Gold for me, and the junior Gold for himself. The venue was quite acceptable, most of the events were well-run and the attendance was up on last year. Now they've got the same venue booked for the next four years maybe they can attract more entrants.

Mindsports rounded off a good month for Ben as he achieved the necessary A level results, 2 A's and a B to ensure his place at Durham university. He'll be going there next month and can talk of nothing else at present.
