Sporting Superstars 2004

This will run virtually the same as last year. Only one set of orders is required. Choose one sports person from each of the ten categories BUT the total value of the ten grades must be 30 or more. You can achieve this in any way you choose :- 5 x grade 1 and 5 x grade 5 or 10 x grade 3 are just two possibilities. All events are for next year (2004) except for the football which will be the scores achieved in the 2003/2004 season. There follows a brief review of the scoring criteria for the benefit of new players.

- 1) Premier league matches. We now use the scores in the BBC online fantasy football league. Defenders score one point per appearance with an extra 2 points for keeping a clean sheet and minus 1 point for each goal conceded. All players score 2 points for an assist and 3 points for scoring a goal.
- 2) Snooker players earn points in the B&H? Masters (February) the World Championship (April) and the UK Open (October/November), Win 30, Runner-up 20, Losing semi-final 10, losing quarter-final 5.
- 3) Tennis players score points in the four Grand Slam events Australian (January), French (May), Wimbledon (June) and US (September). Win 30, Runner-up 20, losing semi-final 10, losing quarter final 5.
- 4) Formula One drivers score the number of points they gain in the 17 Grand Prix races held from March to October/November. Win 10, 2nd 8, 3rd 6, 4th 5, 5th 4, 6th 3, 7th 2, 8th 1.
- 5) Jockeys score points for finishing in the first three of a classic horse race. 1000 and 2000 guineas (May), Derby and Oaks (June) and St Leger (September). Win 30 points, 2nd 20, 3rd 10.
- 6) Golfers score points for a top ten finish in a major. Master (April), US Open (June), The Open (July) and US PGA (August). Win 30, 2nd 20, 3rd 10, 4th - 10th 5.
- 7) Cricketers score 10% (rounded down) of the points they score in the Daily Telegraph fantasy cricket league. Players score 2 points for an appearance, 1 point for every 5 runs scored, 5 points for each wicket taken and 3 points for every catch held. Batsmen score -10 for every duck. Bowlers score -1 for every 10 runs conceded. There are bonus for making a century (10) and for taking 5 wickets in an innings (5) Scores in Test matches (and International one-day?) are doubled.
