But Tigger isn't going - it's here to stay and in it this issue we will continue to plague everyone with anything which isn't related to politics, the World Cup or Diplomacy. This issue, hopefully will contain the first independent Tigger game start, two transferred games from Hannibal the reprinted rules of a wonderful game - Parliament and many other goodies. This issue of Tigger is costing you 2p and might be coming with Hannibal 12.

Mick Bullock in the last 1901 while giving us a plug said..."Postal Monopoly?". Well Mick I suppose we'd better explain.

The main problem in adapting Monopoly is making it simultaneous. The only solution is to make sure that it remains consecutive. Here is the system we propose to use.

- 1) At the start of the game all players will have their addresses printed and their position (Go)
- 2) With their name will appear a number, their first dice roll.
- 3) Knowing where he is going to land, a player can then submit a bid for the property (if any) on which he is going to land. This bid must as a minimum be the face value of the property.
- 4) Should two players be scheduled to land on the same square, then they must both submit bids for that property, the highest one succeeding.
- 5) The GM prints all the moves and their results along with the dice rolls for the second turn.

And so it goes on. That is the basic move system. However there are other problems such as; Chance and Community Chest cards, Houses/Hotels, Mortgages, and various other things. Solutions:-

The cards...A player receiving a card is secretly informed of the effect of it and must then make his move dependent on the outcome. One thing that might cause difficulty is if someone draws 'Pay a £10 fine or take a chance.'

Houses/Hotels and Mortgages are simply ordered when you want them. They do not take effect until the following turn..

You could call those a set of postal rules but there are bound to be plenty of flaws in it so everyone think about it and let us know what our errors are.

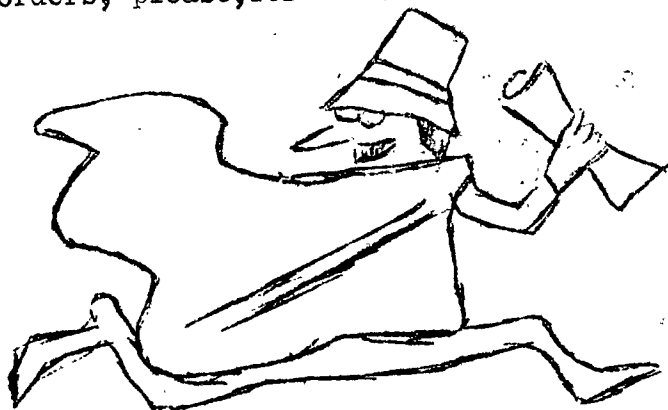

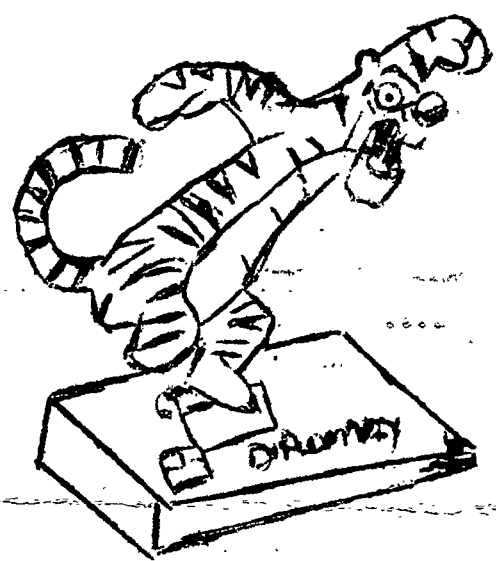

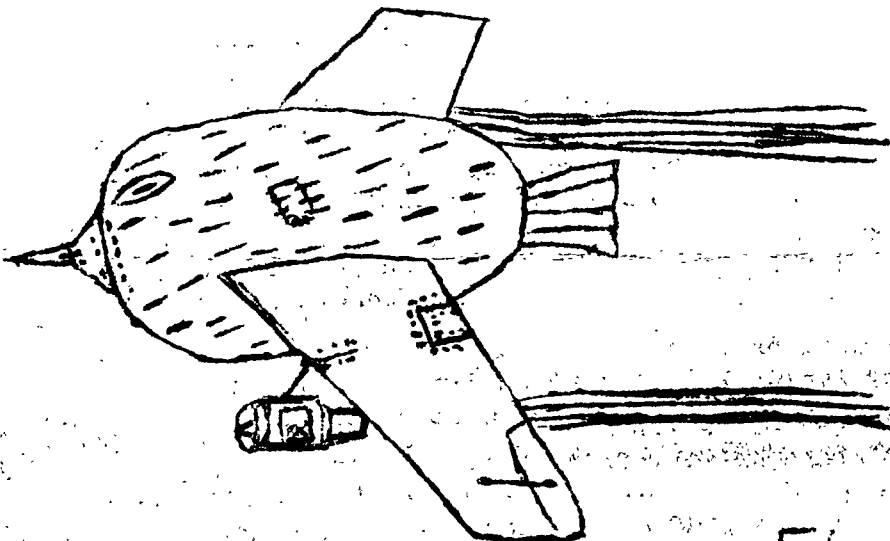
Apologies for what I think will not turn out to be a very good cartoon. It was copied from an 'Asterix the Gaul' thing and was a bit too detailed to put in really.

Parliament: We rang up Hartley Patterson, the designer of the game and asked him if we could reprint Parliament and he suggested that we got some copies off him. So, no Parliament for this issue. Next issue it will turn up as either a Tigger or even a Hannibal supplement. If it comes with Tigger then it will cost whatever Hartley charges us. About 2-3p I suspect.

The game covers political events in a mid-European country. There are seven players representing the leaders of political parties. These parties vie for control of the country by winning large slices of votes in an election. The largest party then presents a budget and.....

We are now going to ring Sherb to see if he's done his orders yet.... He's refused to do any but says he'll send them by next deadline. So next issue will contain moves for Vandal, Hun and Roman moves

Next issue will also contain, if we're lucky postal rules for Cluedo. These were originally printed in John Boyer's Aquarius - an American zine on the same lines as Tigger. Obviously we hope to be able to open up a trade with him and if he can get his Cluedo rules to us in time then they will appear with next issue.

This issue is going free to quite a few people who we know will not yet have received copies of the flyer. I am typing this on the day after the Hannibal 12 deadline. As yet, Hannibal 11 (and Tigger flyer) have not yet gone out to non-players. What efficiency !!!

A small note on some of the games we have openings in. Origins is produced by Avalon Hill for £5.60 and is available from Hamleys in Britain. Decline and Fall is £3.60 from Wargames Research Group, Hamleys, Simulations UK, most model shops and one or two ordinary shops. Risk, Monopoly, and Cluedo are available just about anywhere. Contraband is probably just as easy to get hold of. Sigma File is made by Seven Towns (?) and is available by retail. Sleuth and Acquire are from 3M and are available from the Games Guild. Sleuth for £2.70 and Acquire for £5.80.

These last two seem to be a bit overpriced. Sleuth in particular is at a ridiculous level, considering its contents. One set of rules, two packs of cards and a pack of papers for working out the missing jewels, all packed in a very small box. It is possible to photo-copy the rules and make your own cards with old scraps of card for about 25p. Admittedly the finish might not be as good but it does save you £2.45.

Of course, 3M might not like it but who's going to tell them?! If I'm right Steve Biggs is lacking a copy of Sleuth and if he writes and asks us then our copy of the rules might just happen to fall into a photocopying machine.

Can we have some articles, letters, drawings.... anything you consider worth printing please. If you can't think of something you might be stuck with some rule discussions etc. written by us! So please will you send us some thing? Postal rules for any games are much appreciated. Also if you have any suggestions as to how to improve Tigger we will be interested.
