Star Trader A game is in progress, but can take another player or two. Full rules will be provided. [start-up fee payable]

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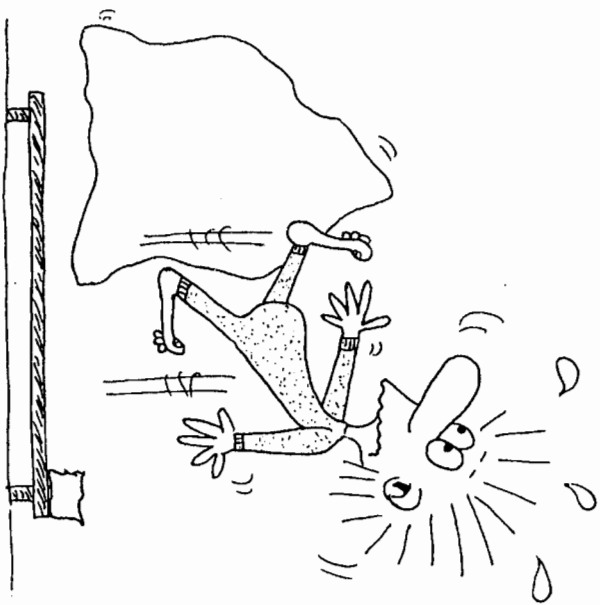
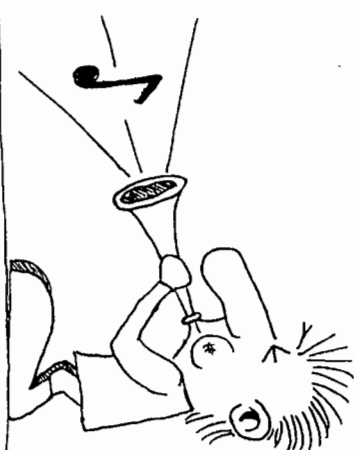

I'm taking another break early in September and will be returning on the 13th. I will adjudicate LPBS as soon as I can after that and I don't expect next issue to be published late. However, I won't be around to issue my usual e-mail reminder of the deadline or answer queries.

The *Star Trader* report hasn't arrived as I type this. I know Mike was having some problems and had to re-adjudicate the previous turn. We'll get the report to players as soon as we can.

Great British Beer Festival 2003

There was much pleading for a name check from some of those I was with at this year's do. So, the group was Neil, James and their mate Chris, Bill, Michelle and Mark and Hilary. Satisfied, guys?

As always, I started with a familiar beer: Gales's Best (brewed by Gales in Hampshire at 4% alcohol). The name has been changed to GB and it's a bit yellower than I remember – amber rather than brown. There was very little smell to it, and that was sour. Disappointingly, there wasn't much taste, either. But it was bitter and went down well with my 'Real Cornish Pasty'.

As it was convenient, I headed for the Bar Nouveau – a bar given over to newer breweries. The first beer I tried was Pacific (Bazens' Manchester, 3.8%). It was slightly lighter than my previous pint, a golden-yellow colour. The beer had a nice, fruity aroma and a smooth, fruity taste. I suddenly realised that there was no fizziness to the beer at all – despite the respectable head. It was definitely dry and bitter, though, so not bad.

Next was Golden (Winters, Norfolk, 4.1%). This was another golden yellow beer with a strong, pungent smell and taste. It came across as fruity, malty and not too bitter. Another decent pint.

Moving on to the Wales & West bar, I tried Gold Brew (Bullmastiff, Glamorgan, 3.8%). This was a yellow beer with little nose. The taste was very fruity and slightly nutty, with a nice, dry finish. Not bad at all.

Sticking to the same bar, I tried Wild Blonde (Sutton, Devon, 4.4%) in the mistaken belief it was a wheat beer. Despite the name, this was an amber

colour with just a faint aroma of malt. It was quite a refreshing drink with a nice amount of bitterness. But definitely not a wheat beer.

On the other hand, Wheat Beer (Beartown, Cheshire, 5%) definitely is. Found on the West Midlands bar, it was pale yellow, as expected, but otherwise underwhelming. It was certainly refreshing, but had disconcerting overtones of cat pee (or maybe blackcurrants). It grew on me after a while though, so not bad.

T'Other (Teme Valley, Worcestershire, 3.5%) was another brew off the West Midlands bar. It had a unquestionable aroma of coffee -- or at least something roasted! (I got a second opinion. And third...) It's a golden yellow beer with a musty, biscuity taste. Strange, but certainly not unpleasant. I don't understand why it has a Yorkshire name, though.

Even more simply named was Ale (Weatheroak, West Midlands, 4.1%). This had a very fruity nose after the last one. It tasted fruity, too and was nicely dry. (My tasting notes seem to be getting shorter as I go on. I wonder why?)

There was a large crowd round the Scotland bar, presumably because this year's Champion beer (Bitter & Twisted from Harriestown of Clackmannanshire) was only available here. I sneaked onto the fringes and tried MacIar (Okells, Isle of Man, 4.4%), another wheat beer. A pale yellow in colour, it had no smell and was completely flat. There was precious little taste, either. My only disappointing beer of the day.

Giving up on the Scotland bar, I went for an old favourite and previous Champion beer, Landlord (Timothy Taylor, West Yorkshire, 4.3%). An amber pint with lots of bitterness. Yummy! A classic.

All in all, a pretty good day's drinking. And I was still sober enough to find my way home without incident!

Science Fiction

Gwyneth Jones's *Bold as Love* has clearly got to me -- two days after I finished it, I'm still thinking about it. Or perhaps arguing with it would be a closer description. Thing is, it's a great story that kept me spellbound and the main characters are fascinating, but from early on I found the backdrop and some of the events just unbelievable. So the whole thing was a struggle with my suspension of disbelief. Perhaps that's what it's meant to be?

Anyway, some descriptive stuff first, so you can see what I'm talking about. The book is set in a near-future (or possibly alternate reality) England. This is an England suffering the climate changes of global warming: it's cold and

wet and wracked by vicious storms. It's also an England suffering from a lack of political leadership (or even talent – if I'm reading between the lines correctly). As the book opens it is Dissolution summer, just before the repeal of the Act of Union, which will separate the constituent countries of Britain.

We are introduced to Fiorinda, a precocious sixteen year old on her way to perform at Reading Festival. She has a suitably dysfunctional family background for a rock princess. Then she gets involved in an attempt by the Government to get into the good books of the 'counterculture' (Jones's catch-all for the hippies, travellers, rockers and others who are the most significant part of the English population in this story). Here we meet some other musicians, who, when things turn nasty, become the other heroes of the book – which is not, as I first thought, solely Fiorinda's story.

So here we have the eclectic triumvirate of Fiorinda, Ax Preston (guitar-playing lead of West Country group The Chosen Few) and Sage Pender (aka Aoxomoxoa, the wizard behind Grateful Dead-worshipping techno-band The Heads). In their own way, each is damaged and each is brilliant. The story essentially charts their rise to power as they overcome the obstacles that confront them and the nation.

But I just find it all unbelievable. For a start, where's the rest of the population? The only part of England that seems to matter is the counterculture. The rest are, presumably, content to follow the lead of this odd bunch (think Sting, Ozzie Osbourne and Kate Bush running the country!) and can be pacified with rock concerts. Then there's the way crises just erupt with no warning. The trio disperses to deal with things, then regroups and holds a celebratory concert (okay, I'm over-simplifying, but that's what it feels like).

And then it ends with: "The story continues in *Castles Made of Sand*".

All of which contributes to the strange feeling of dislocation I had reading this book. This is not the England I know. (The feeling of alienness is strangely reminiscent of Samuel Delany's *Dahlgren*, which is an altogether other story.) And the end result is to divorce me from the characters and the book. Was that the intention? At least one reviewer seems to think so (assuming the quote on the book cover represents his thoughts accurately).

Despite my carping, I found that I couldn't put the book down. The story had me gripped even as I griped about some of it. I guess so much of it feels so real that the bits that obviously aren't grate on me. I think I would prefer it to be all fantasy or all real. But I'll be back for the next book.

Letters

Neil Packer has some SF comments to add.

I sent you a review for *Revelation Space* some while ago (probably early last year) and mentioned that it had prompted me to buy the next instalment in the series, *Chasm City*. I can't really remember a hell of a lot about the book, except that I decided not to buy any more until someone told me they were worthwhile! So, if you get as far as the third one, let me know.

I did like your comparison between US and UK writers again. I think it's not so much the authors as the industry over there which insists on optimism. They know optimism sells and are less willing to take a risk on a book with downbeat themes. As an example (albeit a ten year old one), one of our biggest selling fantasy authors, David Gemmell, had real difficulty getting published and getting publicity over there. Hearsay has it that it's because he keeps killing off too many of his leading characters. US publishers believed that their public wouldn't like books like that. Not having been over there recently, I don't know if the Gemmell situation has changed, but I'm sure it's a fair bet that the industry hasn't changed its opinions of what the public wants.

Funally enough, the latest *Interzone* mentioned that one of Gemmell's books, *The Legend of Deathwalker*, had just gone into its eighth printing. "Gemmell evidently continues to sell well," the magazine comments. I can't imagine this is purely for the UK market, so I assume he's selling in the States. Neil moves on to films.

I saw *Terminator 3* last week and rather enjoyed myself. The acting level is right down there with the original. Looking good as the new terminatrix, Kristanna Loken demonstrates all of Arnie's acting skill – although Claire Danes does do a good Linda Hamilton impression. The action is as good as you'd expect, but with no real surprises. CGI showing up in every other movie that comes along these days means that it's hard to be impressed by it here. So, the film needs a story. And it's got one which, I think, hangs together well enough to make it worthwhile. Be warned, though – it's not much use if you haven't seen the first two instalments. It kicks off with our hero of T2, John Connor, a decade or so on, convinced that he and Mum didn't save the world and that it's all going to pot, just not at the previously scheduled time. Cue vaguely thought-provoking quiet moments for us to try to work out whether there are paradoxes galore to come or if there will, perhaps, only be one time-line to contemplate. Just as you're getting to grips with this, our two terminators turn up and from then on it's pretty much non-stop action. Of course, belief has to be suspended, but this is not a long movie and it keeps the interest right up to the final scene. 7 out of 10 from me.

Other films which I've seen since I last wrote (including the rather disappointing *Matrix Reloaded*) have disappeared from my local cinemas, but my favourite of the year so far has been *X-Men 2* – take a look if it's still showing. (Not essential to have seen the first one, but it helps a bit.) Also from Marvel was the *Hulk*. Lots of people in the media

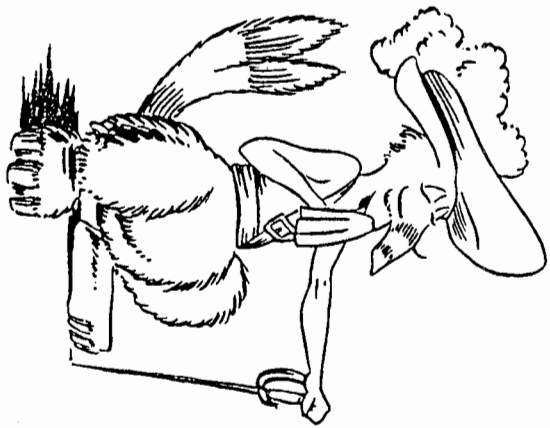

June 1657

There is just time before the army leaves Paris for the summer campaign for a few old scores to be settled. Most of them seem to involve Rene Ouai, who is clearly not popular in Paris at the moment. Nearly as unpopular is Stan Dandy Liver. The best news for everybody is that they're due to fight each other. However, we shall start with Sean Sondamour and Gaston de St Marque. The two men appear to be evenly matched, but Sondamour has a sabre to his opponent's rapier. Charlemagne le Gosse seconds Sondamour, but offers his services as referee when he sees that de St Marque has no support. Sondamour gathers himself and swings his sabre right back for a slash. As he comes forward he meets de St Marque's boot coming the other way. Winded by the kick, all Sondamour can do is surrender.

Buoyed up by his success, de St Marque bounces off to meet his next adversary, Justin Time. The difference between the two men is obvious. Time is a big bruiser, while de St Marque is on the slight side of medium. So Time has size on his side, together with a sabre, greater expertise and a second, Abel Ringeur. Time opens with a furious slash. The slash is blocked by de St Marque, who jumps back from the following cut. He jumps again, avoiding Time's vicious rest, and then slashes on his own account. This strikes just as Time lands a slash. Now the lack of skill tells and de St Marque can only stand there as Time hits him with the first part of another furious slash. De St Marque concedes the fight.

Neither Orson de Combat nor Xavier 3sup arrive to fight Rene Ouai, so Jacques Shitacks is his first opponent. Shitacks has a large advantage in physique that wouldn't have been there had Ouai been uninjured. Marine Shitacks is, of course, wielding a cutlass – with which he is more skilled than Ouai is with his rapier. First blood to Ouai, though, as his sword flicks out for a (furious) lunge. The ponderous cutlass swings round to slash him regardless. Ouai surrenders and is unable to meet the other people waiting for him: Euria Humble, Stan Dandy Liver. Arnaldo de Schwarzenegger should have been there too, but hasn't turned up. He is willing to fight Stan Dandy Liver, but Liver is too hurt to show up, disappointing Lucien d'Escaillehuaillements as well. Liver sends a few hundred crowns each to de Schwarzenegger and Ouai, in recognition of the fine costumes they wore to his bash last month. De Schwarzenegger was "Best Dressed Ruffian", while Ouai was just much appreciated by his host ("his costume could only have been bettered if he had come as a pin-cushion").

Last minute maceuvres

With a third of the regiments due to go into action this month, there are some last minute adjustments to the military positions. But first, Beau Romir and Dan y Beauye support Marc de Zorro's request for the Captain of the King's Escort to resign. The man promptly quits. But de Zorro can't get the appointment as he became a Major last month. Paul d'Geist successfully becomes a Trooper after his application is backed by Euria Humble, Marc de Zorro, Maurice Mineur and Sirius Chien. Dan y Beauye has a word with a Captain of the King's Musketeers, who quits. Jean Petit supports the senior Captain of the Royal Marines against Euria Humble and he stays.

Jean ou Rous buys his way to Colonel of the Gascons and Joseph de Veevre purchases Major in the 13th Fusiliers. More interesting is what happens in the Dragoon Guards. D Arth Vader resigns his commission and promptly applies for re-admission to the regiment. Don de Rico acquires the rank of Colonel and signs up Vader, who buys his way to Major. Alfonso Qué Holique recruits Beau Romir and Charlot d'Evoir for the Royal Foot Guards. They both become Captains. Neither is expecting to be in action, but the Brigadier has other ideas. Yes, the Guards are ordered to join the Frontier regiments.

Guy de Lynes supports Jean de Florette in his application to the Picardy Musketeers. It is successful and he obtains the rank of Major with the help of a loan from Stan Dandy Liver. Now that de Florette will be going into action, First Foot Brigadier Liver lifts his threat to order the 13th Fusiliers into action. Liver then appoints Joseph de Veevre from the 13th Fusiliers as his Brigadier Major, but still has no Aide. The need for a Brigadier Major in the Second Foot sees de Florette get the position just for being there. Co W Ard Extrême signs up Jacques Shitacks as his Aide, getting him into the Second Army HQ. Sean Sondamour finds the right man to be Regimental Adjutant.

Ringeur defends

Brevet General Abel Ringeur commands First Army, which has the job of securing Second Army's lines of communication. Ringeur has brought a personal supply train to augment the Army's catering. The Army has an indifferent month, but is still there. This is enough for Ringeur's rank to be made permanent. As befits his rank, he gets a percentage of the loot gathered, which comes to half a thousand crowns. The same amount is split evenly between his Aide and Adjutant. Royal Marine Major Euria Humble, who is the Aide in question, also receives a little Mention in Despatches. RFG Colonel Alfonse Qué Holique, Army Adjutant, just gets the cash.

Gaston de St Marque also has a brevet rank as the Lieutenant-General commanding First Division. He gains his full rank, a Mention in Despatches and 300 crowns in booty – just a small fraction of the amount he invested in Arms this month. Given that the Second Army QMG, Bdr-General de Lynes, has named him supplier to Second Army, this should do very nicely for him. Three times as much comes the way of de St Marque's industrious Aide, RM Captain Orson de Combat. He also receives a Mention in Despatches and a Knighthood. Another Royal Marine, Lt-Colonel Arnaldo de Schwarzenegger, is Divisional Adjutant and collects five hundred crowns, but nothing else. Apparently he's busy enquiring what happens if the French take some territory. "Will we need a Governor?" he asks.

The Picardy Musketeers run into trouble and run away. The enemy advance is stopped by the 53rd Fusiliers. Lt-Colonel Lothar Rio has no impact on proceedings and gets no reward. He's feeling a bit impoverished, too, after the Shylocks' boys had words with him about an outstanding loan as he was leaving Paris. The mixed result is good enough to get Brigadier Orni Palone's rank made permanent. He adds some 250 crowns to his account. Brigade Major Jean de Florette of the Picardy Musketeers is promoted to Lt-Colonel. A Mention in Despatches comes his way, too and his share totals 300 crowns.

In Third Foot Brigade there is some success for the 27th Musketeers, but none for the 4th Arquebusers. The 4A commander, Bdr-General Jacques N Gilles, is Mentioned in Despatches for his bravery in personally leading patrols. He acquires a hundred crowns as well. Lt-Colonel Gar de Lieu survives without anybody noticing him. This is in contrast to his departure from Paris, when he was caught by representatives of the Shylocks, who take a dim view of people absconding to the front when their debts are due – even if it was less than a hundred crowns.

The 69th Arquebusers take a bashing in Fourth Foot Brigade, but the Gascons hold their ground. Colonel Jean ou Rous takes the opportunity to add 250 crowns to his treasury, while making sure he has plenty of the local vintage with which to "guard his tent".

Colonel Henry Tierry Christian clearly feels that the army needs some cavalry for the campaign. Or maybe he just wants to escape the pressure of being Minister of State. It can't be a shortage of cash, as Chancellor de Marko has sent him a substantial sum this month. The fact that he invests twice as much as this in Arms suggests that he's far from short of money. Anyway, he gives the Queen's Own Carabniers their marching orders. Brigadier-General Sean Sondamour agrees and commands the Archduke Leopold Cuirassiers to join the fray. Something Lt-Colonel Jacques dans le Box was not expecting. After which, almost twice as many regiments as expected are in action for the season.

The Few

So there are few people in Paris for June. The most senior of these is the Field Marshal, Marvin Leigh Rowbow. He takes himself off to the Fleur de Lys for the month with Jane Lapotaire for company. The quiet of the Fleur in summer is only broken by the complaints of Beppe de Marko. He rolls up at the start of June in search of Henry Tierry Christian and can't get past the foyer. After which, he collects Edna Bucquette and heads off to Bothwell's for the rest of the month.

Hunter's is far more popular. Don de Rico and Maggie Niñsent are there all month, as are Guy de Lynes and Thomasina Tancengin. Bud d'Wiser brings Lotte Bottle along for the first two weeks. Then he's off to practice with his sabre for a couple of weeks. Emma Roides gets three weeks at Blue Gables with Sirius Chien, but then he abandons her for a week with his two-hander. Lucien d'Escallehuitaillements spends three weeks in the club after he's paid a visit to the bawdyhouses for some female company. He also gets the attention of the local footpads, but has spent all his cash.

After a success in the first week of June, Joseph de Veevre shows up at the Frog & Peach with May Banquet l'Idée on his arm. They return the following week, but the lure of his rapier is too much for Joseph and he spends a week in the gym. This leaves Red Phillips, where Jean Petit can be found for just the first week of the month, along with Ava Crisp. A couple of weeks with his sabre leaves Jean a week in which to go after some different female company. Bad news for Xavier 3sup. Stan Dandy Liver is declaiming his poetry all month in several different parts of Paris. First one, then another woman refuses his advances. However, he finds a much



more appreciative audience at the next two residences he visits. That means two more "Dear John" letters – for Marc de Zorro and Maurice Mineur.

Revaulvin d'Or is the second man to start his month at the bawdyhouses. Having indulged himself with the ladies, he spends the rest of the month accompanying his rapier to the regimental gym. The Dragoon Guards' barracks are home to D Arth Vader for the whole month as he works out with his sabre. It was either this or spend the time counting the crowns that Chancellor de Marko sent him. However, having invested the cash in Arms, he doesn't actually have it to count.



France attacks!

Austrian attention is focused on the impending coronation of Emperor Leopold, so France can take advantage. The French army marches across its south-eastern borders to lay siege to outlying Austrian possessions. The siege is the responsibility of Second Army, bolstered by the addition of the Guards Brigade and a couple of cavalry regiments. The Frontier regiments have an indifferent time, taking the brunt of Austrian counter-attacks. The Queen's Own Carabiniers charge and rout one of these counter-attacks. Colonel Henry Thierry Christian takes no risks, appropriates some five hundred crowns for himself and is Mentioned in Despatches. Subaltern Mon Dieu Ewe Swine pillages about two-thirds of the amount his CO gets and otherwise keeps his head down.

The Guards Brigade makes a difference. The King's Musketeers attack and capture the gates to the town, but take some casualties. Major Robert d'Bildare leads his battalion in the first charge. A volley from the enemy mows him down. RIP. Brigadier-General Zachary The Money Goes dodges the bullets and continues the momentum. With war-pig Bessie at his side he carries the charge over the enemy ramparts. His name is Mentioned in Despatches and he is elevated to Count by a grateful monarch. He adds 350 crowns to his account; on top of the rather larger sum that Chancellor de Marko has sent him. Captain Maurice Mineur is safe in second battalion, but catches the eye of the Despatches writer.

The Cardinal's Guard follow up the Musketeers to clear the rest of the battlements. Bdr-General Justin Time concentrates on the plunder and takes over a thousand crowns away with him. It is Lt-Colonel Charles à Tanne who takes the lead in the action. For this he is Mentioned in Despatches at some length – and twice. This brings him the title of Marquis. He collects just three hundred crowns of loot. Major Charlemagne le Gosse follows both men: he receives two Mentions in Despatches and just short of a thousand crowns. Brevet Captain Jared Kaph-Kophi is leading his men round the battlements when he spots an enemy officer making an escape. Screaming his blood-curdling battle cry, Kaph-Kophi launches himself at the man. Unfortunately, this is just enough warning for the man to grab a pike and brace it. The result is Kaph-Kophi kebab. RIP.

Guards misfire

As Colonel Qué Holique is serving with First Army, Lt-Colonel Harry Covert commands the Royal Foot Guards. They make little impression on the fight, but get a share of the pickings. There are a couple of hundred crowns for Covert. Three hundred for Major Lokwot Isaw, who is Mentioned in Despatches and gains an Earldom. (Brevet) Major Marc de Zorro gets 150 crowns and nothing else. Captain Beau Romir finds two hundred crowns and Captain Charlot d'Evoir just a hundred. Even Private Paul d'Geist gets in on the act, pocketing some two hundred crowns. Guards Brigadier R Even d'Ypres d'Ete does the best of anybody, totting up just over fifteen hundred crowns. He could do with some staff, though.

There's not much for the Archduke Leopold Cuirassiers to do. Bdr-General Sean Sondamour gets six hundred crowns, but no recognition. There's just half that amount for Lt-Colonel Jacques dans le Box.

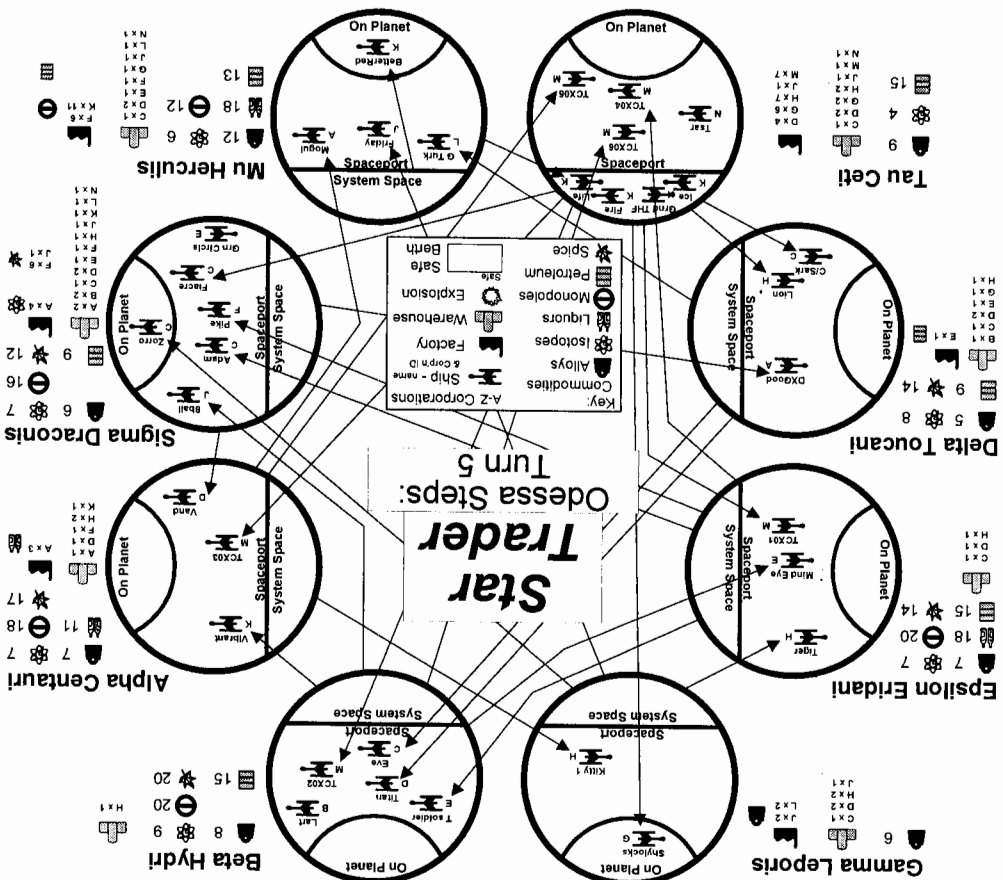
The Frontier Division commander, Claude Byacat, is to be seen among the troops all month, encouraging his men. He is promoted to General and Mentioned in Despatches. He accepts donations from all and sundry, bringing his takings to 600 crowns for the month. There is a Mention in Despatches for his Aide, Marine Captain Xavier 3sup, who racks up 900 crowns in booty. Adjutant Dan y Beauve (Lt-Col, KM) gets the same amount.

General Co W Ard Extrême is satisfied with his first month in command of Second Army. Particularly as he is promoted to be Field Marshal for next year. He earns a Mention in Despatches and five hundred crowns without putting himself in any danger. His Aide, Major Jacques Shitacks of the Royal Marines, earns the same amount and is Mentioned in Despatches. Rene Ouai may be Colonel of the 69th Arquebustiers, but he is serving as Second Army Adjutant. His work in scooping some 800 crowns into his personal coffer is rewarded with promotion to (brevet) Brigadier-General. With this comes the command of Fourth Foot, so he rides off to join First Army.

Star Trader Odessa Steps – Turn 5

"Where did that one come from?" The harassed commander asked his damage control officer as the Flute hull rocked to a blow to the hull.

"Umm, from Fire, sir."

"What?"

"I think it's been captured – look, there's another barrage and it's closing."

"I should have been more suspicious. It was just too easy to intercept." Faced with an attack on two fronts, the commander tried to continue to fire at the main enemy, and avoid the attacks from the rear. The damaged Clarinet hull was still firing at the Culture's ship, but its firepower was weak. The Hull shuddered again.

"Sir, boarders on the scope."

It is debatable which was the biggest event. For most Corporations, the massive forgery, which halved all cash assets, and all debts was devastating. A couple of Corporations seemed to have been aware of the machinations and acted accordingly, being high on debt, and low on cash. For NEKEKAMI and THE CULTURE, it was the combat in Tau Ceti system space which left all 4 ships battered. As they're all in THE CULTURE's hands, NEKEKAMI was hit very hard. The combat swung each way, but the early surrender of Fire and the bad luck suffered by NEKEKAMI's attempts to board meant that all the ships fell, though every one damaged the armed Monarch Hull, and left it with a bare third of its pods intact. Once the loss of the ships was confirmed by a courageous communications officer, the failure of the Tau Ceti Planetary Patrols to intercept any of the ships (though they came close) was further bad news for NEKEKAMI. GRAND LARS THENI were said to be "sympathetic" though no-one would be more specific. The apparent immunity of TAU CETI XPRESS from interception suggests that someone at least may have been paying for protection. For INTERSTELLAR METALS the failure for a second quarter to pay interest on their loan was embarrassing. Perhaps they are hoping for more forgery.

Better Red, as the CULTURE has renamed their captured Flute hull, landed at Mu Herculis and raised 240 HTs selling Weapons. An attempt to increase THE CULTURE's Reputation failed, but Political Connections were increased to 8. The Vibrant was re-crewed with an A class crew. The existing loan was repaid and a new loan for 890 HTs over 4 turns was taken out. Most of this was spent buying 11 Monopole factories at Mu Herculis.

SHYLOCKS were also on planet, at Gamma Leporis, and sold their weapons for 30 HTs a unit. The money was used to improve Reputation and increase Political Connections. Another Corporation received a cash payment and the ambassador still hasn't arrived at his destination, which will teach him to take the 25th century's equivalent of Connex Southwest.

KATKORP sold their Alloys factories at Gamma Leporis and 2 of their Isotope production facility at Tau Ceti. They used the money to increase their Political

Connections. They paid off their (smaller) existing loan and took out a new one for 395 HTs for 4 turns and bought warehouses at Delta Toucanis, and the first warehouse purchased at Beta Hydri. NEKEKAMI had a massive increase in Reputation after their debacle, but it is of little comfort. Their press release was unceremoniously removed from all public shipping offices. At least their outstanding loan is smaller than it was.

TSTI took OP 27 and bought 4 units at Sigma Draconis on Planet. Criminal Connections were increased to 8, and an A class crew was hired for Faiae. Alexis, whose hire was mis-reported last Quarter as the laying down of a Phoenix hull, has joined TSTI and the misogynistic director has already ordered her to Sigma Draconis, far from fashion shops. Apparently her contract is up for sale. TAU CETI XPRESS repaid their loan, and decided not to take out a new one. INTERSTELLAR METALS bought a second warehouse at Gamma Leporis and watched their loan get bigger again with the missed interest being added to the principal.

NEWBIE increased their Business Connections and took out a 160 HT loan from the banks for 4 turns. They also announced that Agent Tender and Agent JB were for hire, contact to be made at the Corporation offices. TOTAL TRANSIT 2070 took out a 300 HT loan over 8 turns - to finance expansion. SMF were quiet and THE UNIVERSAL repaid their loan and are now free of debt.

Sigma Draconis saw INTERSTELLAR METALS buying 9 units for 7 HTs each and becoming a Contractor. The UNIVERSAL and BLAND & BRASS both failed to buy Monopoles as the price rose. IM sold 1 petroleum for 8 HTs, and then finished by buying 5 Spice on their contracts for a good quarter here.

KATKORP failed to buy Alloys at Alpha Centauri as the price rose. INTERSTELLAR METALS were selling Spice, 12 units for 17 HTs each and a Dealership. THE CULTURE sold 7 Monopoles at 18 HTs, but no market position. SWISS MERCENARY'S FLEET sold 3 Liquor for 10 HTs apiece, the last of their factory's production. Passenger carrier TAU CETI XPRESS sold 6 Isotopes for 5 HTs and gained a Dealership, their first market position.

Beta Hydri saw THE UNIVERSAL failing to sell Alloys as they wanted more than the market thought they were worth. TCX sold a single Isotope for 7 HTs. TRANS SOLAR TRADING sold 9 Petroleum at 12 HTs and gained a Dealership, and IM sold 3 more using Percent. KATKORP bought 9 Alloys at Gamma Leporis and no recognition. Epsilon Eridani saw KATKORP selling 2 Isotopes for 7 HTs each and TCX selling 1 for 6 HTs. THE UNIVERSAL bought 1 Spice for 15 HTs.

Delta Toucanis was busy. First INTERSTELLAR METALS sold 7 Alloys for 5 HTs each, then KATKORP sold 12 Isotopes at 8 HTs, followed by TSTI selling 2 more at the same price. TOTAL TRANSIT 2070 were undercut by these two and sold nothing. Petroleum was also active, IM buying 10 for 10 HTs apiece and a Contractorship, THE UNIVERSAL selling 3 for 6 HTs each and then KATKORP buying 3 at 9 HTs. TT2070 did manage to buy 4 Spice for 14. Tau Ceti saw much trading in Isotopes, NEKEKAMI selling 2 for 1 HT each, and then TCX selling 7 at 4 HTs. SHYLOCKS sold 5 on Contract, but KATKORP's bid of 5 to sell was ignored.

Mu Herculis saw BLAND & BRASS selling 6 Alloys at 10 HTs, and TT2070 selling 6 Liquor at 17, this gaining a Dealership. INTERSTELLAR METALS bought 6 Petroleum for 13 HTs apiece, emptying their coffers. Finally, Isotopes saw GRAND LARS THENI buying 16 for 8 HTs each, filling the Monarch hull, and becoming dealers. SHYLOCKS sold 9 for 4 HTs apiece and gained a Contractorship. BLAND & BRASS then sold 2 more at 6 HTs. Only TT2070 were disappointed as no one sold them anything.

GM Notes

Ships are not assumed to be trying to intercept unless stated in your orders; You do not need to write "avoid interception" in your orders.

You can jump into system space and accept interception, as THE CULTURE did this turn.

Combat can take place if a player succeeds in intercepting an incoming ship jumping to a spaceport.

Orders like "return fire with missiles, and then guns" mean you will fire missiles at a ship until they are all knocked out, and will continue to fire with guns after that point.

Illegal goods, such as Slaves, can only be loaded on Planet. Legal trading takes place in spaceports; you cannot therefore buy legal and illegal goods for the same spaceship on the same turn. You can load in the spaceport on one turn, then jump to the planet the next turn and load the illegal commodity.
