While extending sympathy to our 'German brothers' in their distress, the Emperor of Austria & Hungary called for an all-out effort by his armies in their war against Italy. "Not content with their bloody conquest of Italy, their desecration of the Papal states, the Piedmontese now wish to extend their conquests to our lands. They shall not prevail!" Already plans are being laid for the raising of a fresh Austrian army.

Our correspondent in St Petersburg reports an atmosphere of gloom in the Russian capital. News of the fall of Sevastopol to Turkish forces is expected at any time. The war effort has placed severe strains on the Russian economy and cuts in army expenditure are expected in the new year.

Strong diplomatic pressure from Vienna seems likely to lead to the evacuation of Albania by Turkish forces. Well informed sources suggest that the Turkish commander in Greece had acted independantly of the Porte and has been recalled.

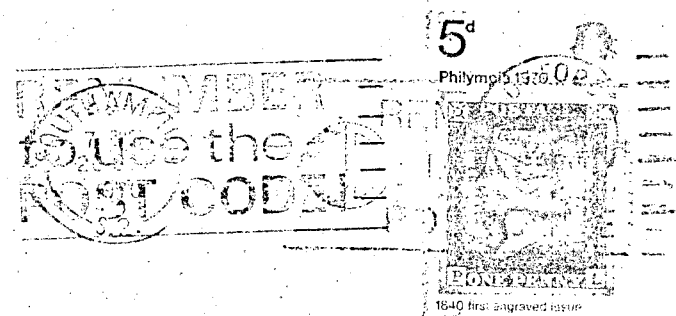
