## In which we are introduced

WB now reaches the end of it's third crisis since it's birth a year ago (the other two being Dave's stay in hospital and the Great Postal Strike). Subject to unforeseen circumstances we should now be back to our normal level of chaos.

I have received a suitably censored pile of correspondence from Dave - however there are probably a number of things I've missed out so if there are any suggestions /requests/offers/demands you've made to Dave recently please repeat them to me - OK?

As noted somewhere else my other publication, Midgard, is not generally circulated, most WB recipients have not reacted to it. If you want further issues you must ask for them.

## Important notices

I don't like move missers - they spoil the game for others.

As from this move:

- (1) Anyone who misses two moves in a row without good reason is thrown out of the game. The country goes into anarchy.
- (2) Unordered units forced to retreat are routed and removed from the board.
- (3) Fresh units will not be placed on the board unless specifically requested by players.
- (4) Retreats not specified will be performed by the GM.

This is a lot more ruthless than Dave has been. Having experienced the shambles

produced in 'A' game by one player dropping out almost immediatly and others missing moves I feel something has to be done.

Units not required to take any action must be ordered to stand - otherwise they are unordered. I'd be grateful if moves were written in this form on the order sheets, though with less abbreviation.
