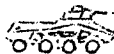

## Convoys again

Last issue you may recall I suggested that there is only one way in which two units can exchange positions and that is by convoy. Eg: A Bre-Pic C by F Eng

A Pic-Bre

In the House Rules this appears (23c) as an extension of Brannan's Rule.

DON TURNBULL wrote to say that this was in fact discussed in Albion 7, and he now follows Brannan's rule except that units in adjacent provinces can't use convoy to change places (this is known as 'Changing of the Guard').

Problem of the Month is related to this, and also comes from D6n:  
T: A Apu-Rom. A Nap S A Apu-Rom.  
I: A Rom-Nap. A Ven-Rom.

Clearly the support of the Naples unit is not cut and Turkey gets Rome, Venice standing and Rome retreating.

What happens, though, if instead of going Rom-Nap direct, the Italian army does so by convoy? According to Brannan's Rule, the support of the Naples unit is now cut, since the attack came from the side. Actually it doesn't affect the ultimate result, but you can see that there are circumstances in which it could have quite a considerable effect.

((Well, what do you think listeners? Should 'changing of the guard' be allowed?))

## Donner und blitzen, ein panzer!

Which is to say my copy of Panzerblitz, the latest AH game, arrived last week (on Friday 13th too!). This is (for the ignorant) a tactical game covering the WWII Eastern front 1943-44. It's considerably different from other AH games, for instance guns can fire over a number of hexs. I've just been playing out the first of the set situations, in which a Russian mobile force attacks a German defensive position. The Russians soon discovered to their cost that the German 88mm guns could knock out a tank at close range with no chance of missing....they also attacked the defences from the wrong side. After an abortive assault on one fort they realised the error, rushed across and disposed of one of the two 88mms, which was not in a fort. By this time the Russians had almost run out of troops, but managed a close assault on another fort before running out of time, which gained them enough points for a tactical victory.

It looks to be one of AHs best games. There are 12 situations to play through, after that you make up your own - the board comes in three sections which can be arranged in different patterns.

I have also just received an S&T back number with Tac 14, a game covering the medieval period in Europe. One interesting rule - feudal cavalry are forced to charge as soon as they spot the enemy - even if their own foot are ridden down!

More on both these games later...that is if you're interested. Or should WB stick to Diplomacy?

Letters

Russia, 'B' Game:-- Sorry, Russia has to concede defeat - and will no longer be in B game. I'm afraid Stella Berg did not do too well - and since an 'anonymous party' took over from her in May, who couldn't play either, it has been a sad show altogether.

John Parker (Turkey, 'B') having received notice of the above says he is willing to concede defeat to Italy/Germany. The GM has been aware for some time that Italy & Germany have been acting together to the extent that one person has been sending in both moves.

Adrian Brine (England 'C'): I am going into anarchy as from this move, since victory for Germany is inevitable. Game C has been rather disappointing, the course of the game being governed largely by the order in which people fell into anarchy.

This would seem to leave two players active in both games. I therefore declare 'B' and 'C' games ended, as victory seems certain for one player in both cases - Germany/Italy in 'B', Germany in 'C'. Those leaving are reminded that if they are not in 'D' or have not paid a sub they are cut off as from this issue.

'D' Game (1971BU) SPRING 1902

I: ((Held over from last season - ie mislaid by GM)) 'The Government of Italy are forced to announce with the deepest regret that, due to the actions of the Austrian Emperor in the rightfully Italian regions of Tyrolia and Trieste, on behalf of the peoples of these regions a war of liberation has been declared so that the Hapsburg menace will never again rise to threaten the peace of Europe and the security of it's inhabitants.'

F: It has now been revealed by the government that the recent blackout in Burgundy was caused by our dynamo peddler Eddie Mucks ~~detaching~~ falling asleep on the job.'

G: note to all Foreign Governments, from Edmund von Thurn & Taxis, hereditary postmaster of the Imperial Postal Service:  
'Due to postal delays (some horses from the PO have been taken over by our glorious army), all foreign governments are asked to send their diplomatic pouches to Germany as soon as possible after each season, in order to allow our glorious Kaiser to answer before the beginning of the following season. If only other European nations would allow us to annex peacefully all the territories that are historically part of our Empire, there would be no other European nations".

GB: The House of Commons, March 29th 1902.

Mr. D. Lloyd-George:- May I ask the Prime Minister if he has any information he can give us today?

The Prime Minister:- Certainly. Our ambassador at Oslo reports that at five o'clock this morning units of the German army crossed the Kattegat and attacked Sweden from their positions in Denmark. The Cabinet has instructed the BEF in Norway to maintain their positions along the frontier and not to intervene. It is for the Swedes to decide between a Teuton and a Slav dominated homeland. I have withdrawn the Channel fleet from Belgium and returned it to support duties, sending the British 2nd Army to aid the King of the Belgians in his attempt to preserve his neutrality. The 3rd fleet has been sent to Ireland to quieten the disturbances there. I must ask this brief survey of recent developments to satisfy the honourable members.
