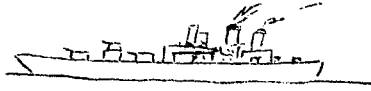

'D' Game 1971BU Autumn 1903

- T: What must the Tsar of Russia now be thinking, as he sits on his arse in his Winter Palace awaiting news of the fall of yet another of his domains? He must anticipate the next few years with dread, for even as St Petersburg is about to fall to the noble Englishman, Turkey is amassing a vast war force in the South, designed to totally obliterate his vile country. No armed force in the history of the world has been so large, nor any cause so righteous as our present purpose: to completely annihilate the impertinent haemophilic pipsqueak Tsar of Russia and make the world safe for all lovers of ~~democracy~~ Turkey!
- GB: British troops today shook hands with their German allies as one final push caved in the final resistance in northern France. Later the Prime Minister, who had travelled to Paris via Belgium, held a joint review of German troops with the Kaiser. Speaking from the Arc de Triomphe the Prime Minister revealed that British intervention in the Russian Civil War was to be escalated. "It is unthinkable," he said, "that the rightful authorities should be threatened by the Marxist upstarts led by the paternalist Viyanov, let alone the armies of the Czar, which dealt so savagely with our Viennese comrades. Those communes established by Prince Kropotkin must be protected and new ones set up as soon as possible. - R: The Tsar today commented on the progress of the war against the aggressive Turks and Huns. "The war proceeds excellently. In the North, the British have been told to evacuate Finland or else. No doubt, frightened by the might of the Russian Bear, the British will obey. In Central Europe, aided by our gallant allies the Italians, Russian troops should soon capture Berlin, the heart of war-crazed Germany. In the South the war against the Turk nears it's conclusion. Under my personal command, the Russian fleet in Sevastopol outthought the Turkish fool and prevented him moving into Armenia, thus putting back the Turkish war effort 12 months. Meanwhile the magnificent Italian fleet, manned by the bravest sailors one could wish for, is about to strike deep into the enemy's waters and ravage his unprotected coasts. Yes, I can see only victory ahead for the Russo-Franco-Italian alliance."
