As you will have noticed, WAR BULLETIN has not appeared since August. At first I had intended this to be a 'summer break', but it's now obvious that my interests have changed and WB has become a burden. So this sheet is to announce its demise.

Partly this is the old feedback problem. I'm a fanzine fan rather than a Dippyfan, and right now my other 'regular' fanzine gets more letters on a single issue than WB gets in a dozen. As you may have noticed I've tried various things: wargame articles, controversy, and most recently reviews, none of which have generated any correspondence worth printing.

And then I'm becoming more involved in other scenes: in 'Dungeons and Dragons', in Dippy variants, in playing FTF wargames, all of which are more fun than typing out WB. Most Dippyazines I get in trade I find uninteresting compared the SF and fantasy fanzines. I don't like the way the hobby in the UK is going, becoming centralised and introverted when I've always felt part of a diverse and world-wide fandom: the NGC is to blame for this I'm afraid, and while I don't agree with the methods of such as Will Haven I'm in sympathy with his concern for the hobby.

Enough of this.

Traders: enclosed is some cash, to be counted as a sub to your Dippyazine backdated to August. I expect to continue to sub to a few, but meanwhile this is an easy way of balancing up.

Americans: you will be receiving the same as above via the ISE. I am sending to Dave Johnson and Edi Birsan with this a list of people.

Players: As you will see 'Roses' finishes this time. A draw is proposed in 'Excalibur' and as Richard Walkerdine has resigned this seems a reasonable conclusion. 'Downfall' and '1973BG' I am willing to continue on a carbon copy basis. 'Parliament' must be dead now as only three players have indicated willingness to continue, and Graham Jeffery is definitely out, we have no standbys of course.

'Carthage' I'm not sure what to do with. I could continue it on a strictly irregular basis - perhaps if it was advertised as a fantasy game rather than a Dippy variant it would attract more interest?

I will assume that those playing in the above three games wish to continue. Other subbers get refunds - if I've got the amount wrong please protest if its too small, keep quiet if its too large!

'Carthage' will have no trades save for the 'obligatory' copies to Walkerdine, Buchanan, Bullock and some Milker Number person. Mick, Who's Where would be enough for a trade, I don't expect anything from anyone else.

'Carthage' will take no non-playing subs - if you want it you have to play, though this need only mean holding a single province.

Other scenes: My fantasy/F&SF game/history/pseudohistory fanzine NEWS FROM BREE had its 16th issue in August, including the rules for an abstract board game, book, fanzine and game reviews, and a list of books in print about Tolkien. Next issue will have quite a lot on 'Dungeons and Dragons'. NFB is free and doesn't accept money.

I shan't be completely disappearing from the Dippy scene, as DARIEN SETTLEMENT 4 due soon will continue with its mudslinging crusade for variants in Europe, this issue will have variants from Doubleday and Clark included. It is also free for the asking, an excellent way of keeping down circulation.

Anyone who remembers MIDGARD would be well advised to read NFB by the way, as plans are afoot for using the original world for a much revised game.
